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IT PROGRAM



Cooperative with Globe University/MSB to bring Information Technology education to Haitian college students. The long term goal is to impact Haiti's economy by increasing the ability of Haiti's young citizens to join in the global IT workforce.

ADMISSION PROCESS

1. Complete tCHF application
2. Provide statement of purpose
3. Provide Picture ID, copy of BAC I & II
4. TCHF notify qualified students to register for exam
5. Sit for Accuplacer testing
6. Interview/Reference checks
7. Notification of acceptance/denial one month before start of program
8. Register at AUC & student fees

QUALIFICATIONS

- ◆ Haitian Citizenship and resident
- ◆ English Knowledge - Advanced beginner or beginning intermediate
- ◆ Baccalaureate graduate, Part I & II
- ◆ Math score of 60%+ in Baccalaureate exams.
- ◆ Willingness to commit to full time study and participate in the IT program for a minimum of 3 years
- ◆ Minimum Accuplacer test score of 35 in Reading Comprehension & Sentence Skills; and 21 in Arithmetic

SCHOLARSHIPS

- ◆ GU will provide full scholarships for the first year of IT courses for the initial 12-15 pilot group students.
- ◆ tCHF will raise the fees for supplies/books and equipment.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Cooperative program to prepare students for positions in web application development, networking, security, computer support, user interface design, internet marketing, computer forensics and database server administration

A stand alone, one-year integrated curriculum of coursework to increase English as a Foreign Language (EFL) skills for Haiti post secondary students while concurrently introducing IT technical skills. Students will be eligible to apply to GU/MSB AAS degree program at the end of the first year.

A total of three-years of integrated EFL and IT education will be field tested beginning October 2010.

The First cohort will consist of 12-15 students. Instructions will be delivered online in English.
